


## St. Agatha's Parish Pastoral Council Update

#### LENTEN CAMPAIGN

The theme of this year's Trocaire Campaign is "Give us this day our daily bread."

Hunger is the most extreme form of poverty where individuals or families cannot afford to meet their most basic need for food. It is sometimes said that the Irish people have a particular understanding of the absolute devastation caused by hunger. Perhaps deep in our collective psyche we can understand, because of our own famine in the 19th century, the catastrophic effect of hunger on individuals, families, communities and entire countries.

This year's Trocaire campaign will focus on Rwanda which is a small land-locked country, about the size of Munster, in the Great Lakes region of east-central Africa.

Trócaire boxes are normally available through the school.

However, if you wish to collect for Trocaire and do not have a *Trocaire Family Box* you can collect one from the repository.

Boxes can be returned to the Parish Office at Easter.
