PEACE COMES FROM THE POWER TO FORGIVE AND LOVE.

In the Second Reading today, St Paul reveals to us that before the world was ever made, God chose us in Christ. We all initially came into existence from a decision made by God in Heaven, long before we were ever conceived in our mothers wombs. That is why St Paul says; God has blessed us with all the spiritual blessings of Heaven in Christ. This means that from Heaven the decision was made to bring us into existence, in this earthly time, as part of God's hidden & predetermined Plan, which was to create us as His adopted children through Jesus, in Baptism.

THY WILL BE DONE ON EARTH AS IT IS IN HEAVEN

So life in the womb does not happen by chance but by God's Grace & Divine Will. God knew us before we were formed in the womb. It is a Mystery of Life & will become very clear after we depart this world. But let's try to understand it now before it is too late. As God's adopted children, we are promised an inheritance of a Kingdom beyond this world! This is the Good News of Eternal Life, which must be purchased. This is done by spending as much time with Jesus in daily prayer and the required Sunday Mass. We are asked to pledge our loyalty to God's Will and Teachings, while we live in this earth. We must remember, God is eternal & always in control. This is the message Jesus gave to the disciples to go out and preach.

CHARITY IS TWO-FOLDED

Just as the prophet Amos, in the First Reading under the Old Covenant, was sent out to preach God's Will to the people of Israel, so too were the Disciples sent out - but in pairs - by Jesus, who is the New Covenant. They are sent on a mission of charity asking the people to repent which will bring peace into their hearts. There is symbolism in the fact Jesus sent His Disciples out in pairs, because the principle of Charity is twofold – Love of God & Love of one's Neighbour.

SACRAMENTAL JESUS IS PRESENT IN THE WORD & THE EUCHARIST [MASS]

The Mission of Christ never changes from age to age & remains a twofold message of Love & Mercy, which are charitable acts. The Disciples were sent out to Heal souls through God's Divine Mercy. His Priests are sent out on the same mission today to heal through Him, in the Sacrament of Confession. Jesus also sent the Disciples out to inform the people of His Divine Love, which He does again, in this age, through the Sacrament of the Eucharist (Mass), which is Love, through His priests. Every Mass informs those present, of God's presence among us. The Eucharist is the ultimate sign of Jesus physically among us in sacramental form. Do we betray Him by not believing this? Judas sat at Table with Jesus but didn't believe. Jesus instructed the Disciples to take nothing for the journey but be happy with what He gave them. St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta once said; *I do own things but they don't own me*. God bless, Fr Brendan
