certificates at a Mass of Celebration in All Hallows last Monday 11<sup>th</sup> September.



## Launch of Crosscare's Annual Appeal

Crosscare, the social care agency of the Dublin Diocese, held the launch of its annual appeal this year in St. Agatha's Food Centre, Portland Row last Thursday. The Appeal was launched by Archbishop Diarmuid Martin.

**Speaking at the launch** Archbishop Martin said: 'Many people do not like using the word "charity". You often hear people saying "I do not want charity, I want my rights, or I want justice". People talk about "going beyond charity". This is because especially in English the word charity has become...associated by many as meaning just handouts, and at times even handouts that are below normal standards.'

The theme of the appeal is based on the scripture quote from the prophet Micah:
