A LESSON IN HUMILITY BY JESUS

The Kingdom of God is often pictured as a Wedding Feast by Jesus. In today's Gospel (Lk 14:1,7-14), Jesus is drawing our attention to the way we relate to each other and the way we relate to God. A self image of importance can see ourselves deserving special recognition, which is pride, and can be destructive to our soul. Jesus is teaching us that we are all equal in the eyes of God and not to think we are better than others.

JESUS IS MEEK AND HUMBLE

Humility is a fundamental practice that marks us as disciples of Christ. The opposite to humility is pride. Pride (Sin), when diagnosed, results in spiritual death, blindness and deafness. Pride gives an exaggerated sense of self-importance to the possessor. The proud become overly impressed with themselves and always want to choose their place at the top of the room or at the top of the table, putting themselves above others. Jesus told us before; *Learn from Me, for I am meek and humble of Heart* (Matt 11:29).

PRIDE PREVENTS ENTRY

The proud, who depart this world, believe they have a right to enter God's Kingdom, and then expect to be seated, at a place of Honour, by Jesus. These are the proud who failed to give Jesus a place of Honour in the kingdom of their own hearts, minds and souls, while on earth. They never invited Him or sat Him down at the wedding feast of their own selfish lives. They refused to exercise their faith or go to Sunday Mass (Sabbath Day), where they could have practiced where to sit around the Wedding Feast Table (Church Altar), communicating with God and getting to know Him. Faith is our passport into Heaven. Without having exercised our faith, it will be very hard to gain entry and be seated. However, all is not lost for the ungrateful dead, because they are prayed for in every Mass, where we implore God to pour the Blood of Purification (Divine Mercy) on their now Suffering Holy Souls, dwelling in the Prison of Purgatory.

HUMILITY IS PLEASING TO GOD

True humility is not having a low opinion of ourselves, but is a heavenly virtue that frees us from a preoccupation with ourselves. Humility enables us to forgive and to act charitably towards each other, without expecting anything in return. Jesus says that, repayment will be made to you when the virtuous rise again. This refers to His Second Coming, when, He will come to Judge the living and the dead.

HUMILITY REVEALS OUR LOWLINESS

Humility helps us to be self-giving rather than be self-absorbed. Humility allows Jesus wipe away our sins of pride in Confessions, with His precious *Blood for Purification*, (Heb 12:24), which helps us avoid Purgatory. Our time is now to prepare for Heaven. To enter Confessions, is to take the lowest seat and after absolution, Jesus exalts (raises) us to a place of Honour, in the eyes of God (*the man who humbles himself will be exalted*). The Kingdom of Heaven is to be given to those distinguished by their humility of soul and they will be seated at the Wedding Feast by Jesus, as equal children of God. Fr. Brendan.
