#### **Report from St. Agatha's Parish Finance Committee**

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On behalf of the Parish Finance Committee, I have pleasure in presenting the accounts for the year to 30 June 2013. These accounts are extracted from the audited accounts which have

been certified by Hayden Brown, Chartered Accountants and submitted to Archbishop's House.

As you know, in recent years, we have been operating in a deficit, and for the year to 30 June 2013 the deficit is particularly high of €15862.This has placed a great strain on our ability to conduct normal business and it is only due to soft loans that we were able to operate.

The income figure has dropped significantly with a considerable drop in the Family Offering. The Family Offering fall seems to be caused not just by the effects of the recession, but also by the sad loss of some of our strongest contributors and collectors. The tax refund scheme has also improved, these are the taxes that the Church can reclaim from the Revenue Commissioners on contributions that are greater that €250 from parishioners.

The copper coin collection has increased by 12% to €4475. This year we had our 100<sup>th</sup> collection but two of our longest collectors, Christine Corry and Tony Lanigan have retired after great service over the 25 years since we started the collection in 1988.

Overall Expenditure has increased by €1539 which is a rise of less than 1% which could hardly be better. I am also glad to report that our Share balance has decreased from a debt of €212,000 last year to €131,000 at 30 June 2013.

On the positive side we have had the good fortune to sell the house previously occupied by Fr. Paddy Devitt. This was completed in June and will provide much needed finance for many projects that we have neglected in the past few years because of financial constraints.

I want thank all of those who have helped organise the Parish finances over the past year, particularly the members of the Parish Finance Committee. I want to acknowledge the active participation at all of our meetings of the Parish Secretary, Maureen Grant. We also want to particularly acknowledge the generosity of the Parish which has always been of the highest order. Even in these straightened times you will see from the Special Collections list that €21116 was raised for collections for outside the Parish and these are documented with this newsletter. To you all our sincere thanks.

For the year ahead our finances are healthier thanks to the sale of the house but we are budgeting a loss for the current year of  $\in$ 17000 excluding remedial work which we will be able to take from the house proceeds. As you know the Finance Committee had been looking at introducing a Parish Lottery but this needs very careful planning and management and it has not so far been possible to get this underway. Our view is that the climate is just not right at the moment for a scheme such as a lottery.

If you have any questions in relation to the accounts I will be happy to address them for you at any time and I can be contacted through the Parish Secretary.

Finally behalf of the Parish Finance Committee, I want to thank all of you who have contributed to the financial support of the Paris throughout the year and I look forward to your continued support.
