# Fr. Frank Brady, R.I.P. 1927 - 2007

We pray for the repose of the soul of Fr. Daniel Frank Brady, retired Parish Priest of the Parish of St. Agatha who died peacefully in his sleep at Hampstead Nursing Home, Ballymun on Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2007.

Fr. Brady is deeply regretted by his sisters Tessie McHugh and Phil MacDermott and his brother Paul Brady, his nieces, nephews, grand-nieces, grand-nephews, Archbishop Diarmuid Martin, his classmates and the priests of the Dublin Diocese, parishioners of the Parish of St Agatha and friends.



#### **Provisional Funeral Arrangements**

There will be a post mortem on the body of Fr. Brady on Monday morning. Until then no funeral arrangements can be confirmed.

The following funeral arrangements are provisional:

- ⇒ Reposing in Stafford's Funeral Home, North Strand from 11.00 a.m. on Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> February 2007
- ⇒ Removal to Church of St. Agatha arriving at 5.00 p.m. Tuesday where Fr. Brady's remains will be received by Archbishop Diarmuid Martin
- ⇒ Funeral Mass at 11.30 a.m. on Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> February
- ⇒ Removal afterwards to St. Patrick's Church, Glenamaddy, Co. Galway arriving at 7.00 pm. Fr. Brady will be buried with his parents in the family plot in the New Cemetery, Glenamaddy following 11.00 a.m. Mass on Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> March.

#### Fr. Frank Brady, R.I.P.

Fr. Frank Brady was born on 19<sup>th</sup> June 1927 in Glenamaddy, Co. Galway. Son of John J. and Mary Brady, he was one of a family of eight. His father was an Agricultural Inspector and his mother was a teacher in the local national school in Glenamaddy where he went to school. After receiving his secondary school education in Garbally College, Ballinasloe, Co. Galway he came to Dublin and studied for the priesthood in Holy Cross College, Clonliffe.

He was ordained a priest for the Dublin Diocese by Archbishop John Charles McQuaid on 25<sup>th</sup> May 1952. His appointments were as follows:

August 1952 St. Mary's, Merrion Road - Chaplain February 1953 St. Gerard's School, Bray - Chaplain October 1953 Our Lady of Lourdes Hospital - Chaplain

November 1953 Pro-Cathedral - Assistant Priest July 1954 Sean McDermott Street - Curate

July 1959 Clondalkin - Curate November 1966 Swords - Curate

1977 River Valley, Swords - Administrator 1982 River Valley, Swords, - Parish Priest June 1988 North William Street - Parish Priest

He celebrated his Golden Jubilee of the Priesthood on the 5<sup>th</sup> June 2002. He was appointed as Pastor Emeritus to North William Street Parish on 15<sup>th</sup> June 2002. With the deterioration of his health he was admitted to permanent residential care in Hampstead Nursing Home, Ballymun Road in December 2006.

Fr. Brady was an avid sportsman - he represented Connaught in rugby and was a golfer of noted ability. Though a private person he had a dry sense of humour and a good way with words - with the odd astute quip thrown in! He was gifted with a logical and concise mind. He was a shrewd card player and he also enjoyed reading and doing crosswords.

He died peacefully in his sleep in Hampstead Nursing Home on Friday morning, 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2007.
