Both Candles were lit on behalf of the Parishioners of St. Agatha's at the Grotto in Lourdes.



The introduction of the Parish Pastoral Worker is a new initiative of the Arc diocese of Dublin. Sixteen people have been selected to take part in this cou which began in Mater Dei on Monday 15th September 2008. As part of the formation programme the Parish Pastoral Workers will undertake two placements (each of three months duration) in different parishes. The Parish of St Agatha has been selected as one of those parishes and Michael Rose-Nel has been appointed as the Parish Pastoral Worker for the October to January 200 term. 
