The Holy Family of Nazareth is a true model of a Christian home. DON'T LET THE FAMILY DOWN!

To follow Jesus is to belong to this New Family. It is a Family with stronger ties than flesh and blood and worldly values. It is a family which is bound in love and obedience to God, as our heavenly Father and to Jesus as our spiritual Brother. We are called to become a family committed to the Will of God and each other.
