They are then kept at the back of the altar where they are included in the prayer of the Masses in our church until November 2006 when they will be shredded.

*Altar List of the Dead* envelope is included with this newsletter. More envelopes can be obtained from the box at the altar rails. When completed they can be:-

- Placed in the black box at the altar rails
- Put on the collection plate during Mass
- Or handed into the sacristy.
