Matt Talbot was born on 4th May 1856 in 3 Aldborough Court, off Portland Row. He was the 2nd eldest of twelve children.

Before long he established a pattern of work and heavy drinking and by the age of 16 he was a confirmed alcoholic.

Fortunately for him after his so called friends abandoned him, he decided that he would give up drink and take the pledge.

With the help of prayer he reformed his life. Until his death in 1925 he lived a life that was radically different, marked by charity, gentleness and serenity.

Matt is seen as a champion of workers and he played a significant role in his trade union. He experienced unemployment and poverty. World wide today Matt's name is synonymous with fighting addiction of all kinds.

Venerable Mother Mary Aikenhead Founder of the Religious Sisters of Charity



A Cork girl who was born into affluence would be come the defender of the poor.

On the 22nd August 1815, Sr. Mary Aikenhead and Sr. Mary Catherine Walsh initiated their first foundation in North William Street. In September she was appointed as Superior General of

the new congregation. Two months later they opened their first school in North William Street now known as St. Vincent's Girls and Boys schools. By 1827 the school catered for 126 Roman Catholic pupils, 26 of whom were orphans.

From 1816 Sr. Mary Aikenhead and Mother Catherine visited the sick in their homes and were a familiar sight in the streets, lanes and alleys. They brought much practical support and consolation to the sick and the poor as they cared for, talked with and prayed with them on their visits. They helped many people as they faced death through suffering and sickness.

Pope Francis declared Mother Mary Aikenhead Veneralble in March 2015.

A Plaque will be unveiled on the wall of St. Vincent's School on North William Street after the 10.30 am Mass next Sunday 13th September in honour of Venerable Mother Mary Aikenhead.
