### Change of Priests in Parish of St Agatha

Congratulations to Fr Frank Brady who celebrated the Golden Jubilee of his Ordination on 25th May 2002. He has retired as Parish Priest after fourteen years in the parish. Now that he has retired he has been given the honorary title of Pastor Emeritus to North William Street.

Fr Brady has been replaced by Fr Liam Rigney who has been appointed as Administrator of North William Street Parish.

Fr Patsy Kelly has been transferred as curate to Harrington Street Parish and is being replaced as curate by Fr John Galvin from Harrington Street Parish.

Fr Paddy Devitt - whose main work is in Mater Dei Institute continues as Parish Chaplain.

#### Work to begin on re-pointing and stone-cleaning exterior walls of church and conservation of statues

Following a Report on the structural appraisal of North William Street Church by Barrett Mahony Consulting Engineers in November 2000 much work was completed on the church building, for example

- the repair of the roof slates and ventilation stacks in the roof,
- gutters and windows,
- the removal of dry rot and refurbishment of the church porch on the North William Street side of the church.

Starting soon, work will be carried out on re-pointing the exterior walls of the church. The walls are a coarsed dressed limestone with a cut grey limestone and are in need of re-pointing in several areas.

Damp penetration is evident in certain areas of the church.

The stone will be cleaned to look like a church which is 100 years old—and not cleaned to look as if it were newly built!!

> The three portland stone statues on top of the front of the church are very eroded. The plan is to conserve the statues against further deterioration rather than repair them.

- Full details were given at the last **open meeting of parishioners** on 27th May 2002
- **Approval** given by the Finance Committee in Archbishop's House
- **Supervisor** Barrett Mahony Consulting Engineers
- Contractor Skyline Steeplejacks Ltd
- **Cost** will be met from the parish deposit with *Share* ( after the sale of the presbytery at No 88 Ballybough Road) and a grant from the National Conservation Grants Scheme.
- **Time** estimated at 18 weeks after the scaffolding goes up.
