St Agatha's Parish Assembly 1st March 2009



The afternoon was facilitated by Leonard our pastoral worker, it began with prayer and Fr. Brian and Dan, chair of the Parish Pastoral Council, addressed the assembly and gave a summary of recent parish activities, e.g. the work of the outgoing council, the centenary celebrations, the new parish office and the development of the family mass.

Those gathered were divided into four groups and addressed a number of questions. Here is a flavour of what was of concern: **á** more social gatherings needed, **á** visitation, **á** 1st Friday confession, **á** what can we learn from other parishes, **á** transport for house bound, **á** explore ways of becoming part of the parish, **á** newsletter distribution and production, **á** adult faith formation and evangelisation, **á** new ministers of the word and Eucharist and the possibility of a cup of tea after mass on Sunday.

Refreshments were then served and a sub group of the PPC analysed all the four groups' areas of concern. The broader feedback was summarised as follows:

- 1. Children, e.g. prayer, liturgy and teaching.
- 2. Nourishing existing faith community, e.g. adult faith development.
- 3. Reaching out e.g. Communication, parish web site, newsletter.
- 4. Cultural/ Social Integration, e.g. social gatherings, foreign nationals music and culture.

Fr Brian opened the second part and asked for ideas for advancing the four areas above and the following further feedback was received.

- 1. Very good response to the family mass.
- 2. Lectio Divina, Mission week, faith discussion groups.
- 3. Communication, newsletter delivery to every home in the parish.
- 4. Explore broader cultural integration in the parish.

Fr Brian and Dan thanked all for their contributions and the people who are to address the issues above. The afternoon was concluded with a prayer. The Parish Pastoral Council will explore ways of advancing the concerns and ideas raised.


Don't forget! Mother's Day Sunday 22nd March
