
Pilgrimage to Lourdes - September 2007

Sick Pilgrims Section

The Dublin Diocese is bringing 180 Sick Pilgrims to Lourdes from 7^{th} to 12^{th} September.

The Sick Pilgrims will be staying in the Accueil, which is close to the Grotto. They are cared for by voluntary doctors, nurses and helpers from all over Dublin. There are some helpers traveling from the Parish of St. Agatha to care for the Sick Pilgrims. Fr. Liam Rigney is one of the Chaplains to the Sick.

The subsidised fare on this section is €450. If some pilgrims are unable to afford some or most of the fare they are paid for by the *Lourdes Invalid*





There is also a group of pilgrims from the Parish of St. Agatha traveling to Lourdes with the Dublin Diocesan Pilgrimage from 7th to 12th September. The group will be traveling with Joe Walsh Tours and staying at the Agena Hotel. The cost is **€65** (based on sharing). The group leader is Sr. Bridget O'Connor.
